

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Foreword

he California Association of Directors of Activities (CADA) is proud to present the *Student Activities and Leadership Standards*. Established in 1958 as an organization to support California's Student Activities Directors, CADA has grown into a nationally recognized organization. CADA helps California's Activities Directors by providing local and state training for both the Activity Director and the students.

In 2001, the CADA Board of Directors felt the need for a document to respond to the increased demand on today's school leaders to be accountable for the standards of education. A committee was formed consisting of 7 board members: Denise Van Doorn, Area G Coordinator, Mark Lantz, Area E Coordinator, Mark Dutra, Area C Coordinator, Cindy Bader, Area B Coordinator, Jim Nyberg, Past President, Don Dagne, Vice President and Kathy Curtright, President.

The *Student Activities and Leadership Standards Manual* is designed for school principals, associated student body and activity directors, counselors, administrators and classroom teachers who are responsible for the student body activities, especially in a classroom setting.

The manual is set up in 5 Strands: Communication, Personal Growth and Development, Government, Service Learning, and Business. Each Strand is divided into Standards, and then each Standard has Benchmarks. Any student activities program or leadership class offers many opportunities for students to experience these standards. Please note that the opportunity or mastery of some of the standards is subject to many factors such as grade of the school (Jr. High or High School), the format of the class, the availability of the Activities Director and the school population.

We have designed the manual with Activities and Resources. As each school is very individual and unique, so is each activity program. Therefore, we left a place where you can add your own activities to the list. We have also included in the appendix a checklist to use for easy tracking of standards and objectives acheived.

We have also aligned our Leadership and Student Activity Standards with State Adopted Content and Challenge Standards. Please see the Appendix for further details.
