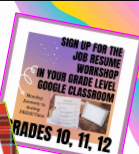
**Unity:** the state of being united or joined as a whole

- Suggestions: find a coworker to co-host with you or choose ASB students to co-host!



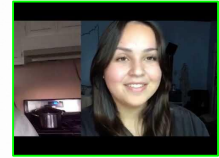
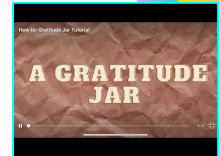
## CLASS PARTIES AT LUNCH

- Create a class color themed powerpoint with riddles, discussion questions, brain teasers, polls, etc.
- Create a Kahoot with questions that are specific to that grade level

- Advertise using social media accounts
- **Host all class parties in the same week; encourage staff to attend**

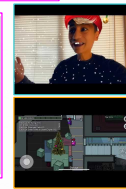


## ESCAPE ROOMS WITH THEMES

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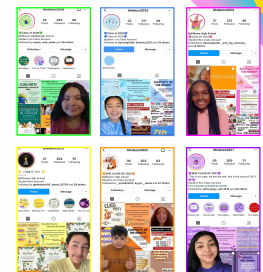

- Showcase lists of every student who have achieved Honor Roll, Perfect Attendance, other awards, etc. (over 800)



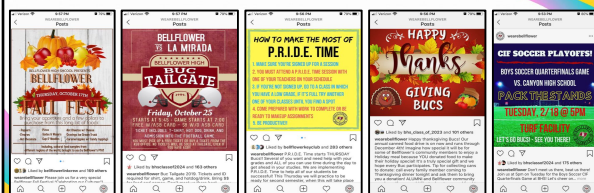
Challenges faced: the student ultimately has to make the final edits on their own computer + lack of computer memory/storage space.

## INTERNATIONAL WEEK

- Meet with Inter Club Council regularly leading up to event.
- Celebration of cultures
- Club revival
- Every club/organization makes a Bitmoji classroom with links to things relevant to their group.
- Each ASB member makes 59 second video with 5 facts about 1 country using thumbnail (to the right). Post on IG feed in groups of 10 by continent.
- Every club/organization hosts some kind of workshop during lunch, open to whole school.
- Create an event calendar with workshop/event times.
- Traditionally: A half-day festival where clubs, organizations, and teams sell food, drinks, and goodies, or host games

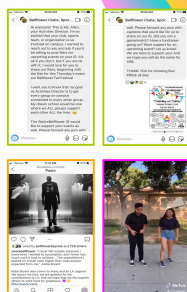

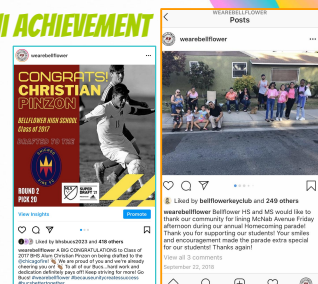
## GAINING MORE FOLLOWERS

- Post regularly: feed posts, stories, reels
- Give access to 2 responsible ASB kids, College and Career Center staff, librarian, etc.
- Cover athletics, classes, activities, accomplishments, staff/club, community members, and families.
- Create a group DM with all club accounts to message them directly for support. Allow them to message you back.
- Clarify that a school account is NOT an ASB account.
- Encourage every class, club, team, and organization to have their own account.
- Class accounts have matching handles that say "student run".
- Encourage these accounts to interact with each other by liking and commenting frequently.
- Follow other accounts that support your school.
- Address current trends and new stories.
- Save stories to your Highlights.



## CELEBRATING FAMILY AND COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND ALUMNI ACHIEVEMENT

- Recognize and thank your community regularly on your social media accounts.
- Post pics of parents/grownups and families supporting their students.
- Post pics of alumni achievements!
- Post pics and shoutouts of local businesses who support the school: Create a story that says, "DM us a picture or @IG of your small business and we'll post it to our stories today."
- Follow the organizations that support our school on social media. Tag them and like their posts.



## SHOW STAFFULTY GIVING BACK

- Staffluty gives a lot. This is usually a behind-the-scenes thing, but we want our community to know how much we give.
- Post pics of staffluty donating presents, food, blood, etc.
- Post pics of staffluty attending fundraising events.
- Post pics that normalize your staffluty.
- Holiday cards, family photos, etc.



## COMMUNICATING WITH ASB

- Band app
  - Chats, folders for uploading pics/videos
- Announcements, signups, birthdays, calendars, etc.
- Send video messages to your kids.  
Try using a Snapchat filter to make it funny and informative.
- We also use this to collect stories for Humans of Bellflower and club takeovers.



## SENIOR SUNSET DRIVE-IN

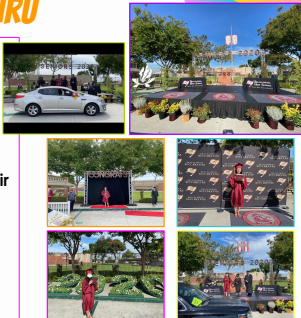
- Seniors were invited to attend with their families.
- Hosted by Class of 2023 Advisors.
- Donations from staff/unity and community to fill swag bags and to give prizes.
- By creating an Amazon wishlist and sharing it on community Facebook pages, we collected over \$1000 in donated prizes including candles, fighting for their bedroom, gift cards, water bottles, etc. etc. EVERY senior left with a prize valued at \$15 or more.
- Swag bags for every senior.
- Created a 80 minute video that premiered at 5:30pm start time; videos projected in the classrooms and they could also watch it on their cell phones.
- Volunteer DJ
- Video edited shoutouts collected from seniors prior to event.
- The student singer, Kohout with questions tailored for the Class of 2023, announcement of Senior Superlatives for the yearbook (each earned a certificate, celebration of Fall Sports seniors (each athlete was given a poster), and multiple prize giveaways. - Read student's name over speaker

- Drive-Thru Grad was followed by a virtual graduation premiere on our YouTube channel

- Ordered personalized Yard Signs for every graduate
- Administrative, Counseling, and Activities Team delivered Yard Signs to every Senior's home.
- Visited 347 homes
- Successfully delivered 307 Yard Signs



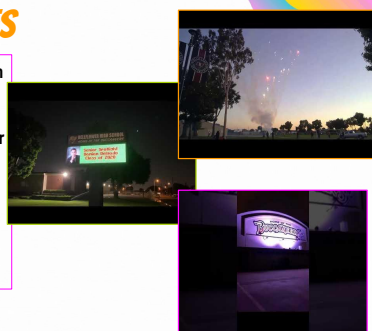
## ADOPT-A-SENIOR

- Rented 30 foot lift to hang decor from the ceiling



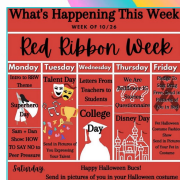
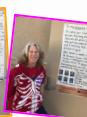
## RED RIBBON WEEK

  - Stay Drug Free Friday (wear red)

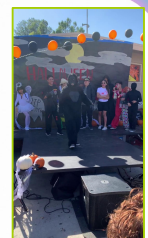

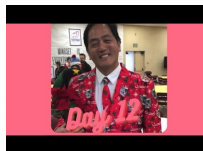


## 14 DAYS OF VALENTINES

- Students sign their names on the posters to show commitment
- Posters displayed all year in cafeteria



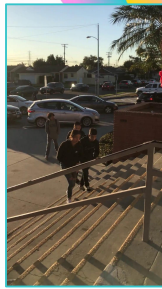
## SENIOR LEGACY DAY
